**School Facilities Improvements
General Obligation Bonds \$17,881,998**

The District's Board of Directors adopted Resolution 3-15/16 regarding its proposal to issue \$17,881,998 of General Obligation Bonds. The bonds would have a maximum term of 25 years; annual property taxes would be levied to pay and retire the bonds. The bonds will finance renovation of the elementary school and high school, and construction of a middle school, enhance safety and security, and accomodate student growth, lower class sizes, and STEM (science, technology, engineering, and math) programs, library and activity facilities for student and community use, and other improvements, all per Resolution 3-15/16.

**Bonds to Construct, Renovate and Improve School
Facilities**

The Board of Directors of Quincy School District No. 144-101 adopted Resolution No. 12-15, concerning a proposition to relieve overcrowding and improve safety and infrastructure. This proposition would authorize the District to: construct a new high school, renovate Quincy High School for Grades 6-8, renovate Quincy Junior High School for Grades K-5, construct gymnasium additions at George, Mountain View and Pioneer Schools, construct classroom additions at George School, and make other capital improvements; issue no more than \$108,255,000 of general obligation bonds maturing within 20 years; and levy annual excess property taxes to repay the bonds, all as provided in Resolution No. 12-15.
